*[The medieval church of St Peter in
Preston Park is no longer used for weddings.]*

Can we marry at St John's Church?

Yes, you can marry at St John's if

one of you:

- 1 lives in the parish (that's the area of Brighton served by St John's)
- 2 is on the Church Electoral Roll at St John's

You can also marry here if

one of you:

- 3 has at any time lived in the parish for a period of at least 6 months or
- 4 has regularly gone to normal church services in the parish church for a period of at least 6 months or
- 5 was baptised (christened) in the parish or
- 6 was confirmed in the parish or

one of your parents at any time after you were born:

- 7 has lived in the parish for a period of at least 6 months or
- 8 has at any time regularly gone to normal church services in the parish church for at least 6 months or

one of your parents or grandparents

- 9 was married in the parish

Please note: for 3-9 above you will need to provide the evidence of this qualifying connection to St John's.

If none of 1-9 applies, you can still marry here if

- 10 you are granted a Special Licence by the Archbishop of Canterbury (*Please note: these are not granted automatically – and they are expensive!*)

What if one of us is divorced?

In the Church of England it is now sometimes possible to be married in church if one of you has been married before and your former spouse is still alive. The priest is happy to explore such requests on a case by case basis in accordance with nationally agreed guidelines.

When can we get married?

- * anytime between the hours of 8.00 am and 6.00 pm
- * normally weddings take place at St John's on Saturdays

What can St John's offer?

- * an attractive building with a light, spacious interior
- * the option of hiring the Knoyle Hall for your reception
- * a warm, friendly and supportive community
- * our prayers as you prepare for your wedding day
- * a chance to think about God and his place in your life
- * talented musicians and flower arrangers
- * an opportunity to think about your future life together
- * a walk-through rehearsal before your wedding
- * the possibility of involving friends and family in your marriage service through readings, music, and prayers

How much will it cost?

A simple, basic wedding at St John's costs £307.50 in 2011. Popular add-ons include:

- * music: organist (£80) and choir (£70)
- * flowers: as a guide, pedestal arrangements cost around £60 each and pillar arrangements £20 each.
- * permission to video-record the service: £30

Legal aspects of weddings

In order to comply with UK civil law, certain legal issues need to be addressed before the wedding takes place.

Briefly, these issues may include:

- * **your age:** if you are under 18, you will need your parents' or legal guardians' consent to marry. By law in the UK, you must be 16 before you can marry.
- * **the calling of Banns:** Banns are an announcement in church of your intention to marry and a chance for anyone to put forward a reason why the marriage may not lawfully take place.
- * **your nationality:** in the case of someone whose nationality is not British, or if one or both of you do not live in England, the Licence procedure may be recommended rather than the Banns route.

However, do not worry about any of this! The priest will advise you and help you to arrange what needs to be done in your situation.
